We provide students with handson, interdisciplinary courses exploring regenerative bamboo building, design, and agricultural practices. In Ecuador, our work focuses on bamboo construction and capacity building for regenerative farming and building techniques on our 70 acre organic agroecology farm, Los Arboleros.



Our Institute was built by a coalition of architects, engineers, carpenters, builders, designers, farmers, and community members modeling green infrastructure through reconstruction efforts in earthquake-stricken regions of coastal Ecuador. Los Arboleros Farm focuses on the production of timber bamboo species, banana, plantain, citrus, cacao, moringa, diverse fruits and vegetables and hardwood species.

Trip Leader Responsibilities:

- Assume responsibility for up to 30 students along with other staff and work as a team to facilitate the inspiring and exciting travel and educational experience of the group.
- Enforce RFI policies and ensure the highest level of health and safety for students at all times.
- Assist in procuring appropriate tools and materials from various community sites and prepping work sites before students' arrivals, keeping track of and maintaining RFI tools, materials, and equipment.
- Translating on site and teaching in both English and Spanish to U.S. students and local Ecuadorian students and community members.
- Assist in delivering critical thinking workshops and group activities designed and executed by RFI staff.
